2.d Module Analysis and Interpretation: historical and methodological issues

Aims: to provide theoretical knowledge and practical skills for analysing and interpreting urban archaeological sites; to familiarize students with the archaeology of Athens

Themes: general introduction to archaeological research and the topography of monuments in Athens; digital documentation methods; the organization of public, domestic, religious and funerary space; site visits to the Akropolis, the Ancient Agora, the Roman Agora and other sites; recent fieldwork triggered by the unification of the archaeological sites of Athens, the development of facilities for the Athens 2004 Olympic Games or the construction of the metropolitan subway.

Methods and Tools: illustrated lectures, site visits, group discussion, e-learning.

Final Assessment: Submission and oral presentation of an essay (3000 words).
